TITLE: Can You Be a Christian and Not Be a Disciple?

A person can profess to be a Christian and yet still live under the impression that they don't need to actually follow Jesus. Being a follower and disciple is seen as an optional add-on, not a requirement. It is a choice, not a demand. Being a Christian today, unfortunately, has little connection with the biblical idea that we are being formed into the image and identity of Christ.

Here are 3 things to believe and consider about your own conversion and discipleship...

- 1. The "gospel Americana" teaches that *conversion* is a first step that seals your fate in the afterlife and *discipleship* in this life is optional. That is nowhere to be found in scripture! Jesus' disciples understood exactly what he meant when he said in Matthew 28, "Go and make disciples all over the world..."
- 2. You'll never make a disciple from a non-discipleship gospel. A gospel that does not include disciples making disciples, and all true Christians are disciples of Jesus, is actually a very truncated gospel and not really the gospel Jesus proclaimed and preached.
- 3. The Bible never commands Christians (or anyone for that matter) to come into the church—it commands Christians to GO... out of the church... and make disciples. If you have been discipled, are you making more disciples today? If you have never been discipled into a gospel that speaks into and touches all of life, the adventure awaits!
